Verse 3a

how shall we **escape**

Verse 3b

if we neglect so great a salvation,

neglect grk: ekpheugo;

to flee away from, to escape from what is before you, right in front of you.

The word "Gospel" means "Good News" or better, "The Good News" Mankind's (1) cleansing from guilt and shame and (2) The reinstatement of man's fellowship with God.

The currency used for that transaction, the payment process is blood.

"Blood – is the single most costly thing known to man."

"Blood – is the second most costly thing known to God."

(the most costly thing known to God is "Love" and love was manifested, physically revealed, made tangible in Jesus Christ.

to "neglect" is to have the wrong view of; life, of heaven, of hell, of holiness, of sin.

"Show me someone who say's "there can't be an actual hell,
that's rediculess, lake of fire, torment and flames - what's the big deal"
and I will show you someone who has a low view of sin and righteousness &
who Jesus Christ is.

So what does "so great a salvation" look like?

John 1:12

But as many as received Him, to them He gave the right to become children of God, to those who believe in His name:

John 6:37-40

All that the Father gives Me will come to Me, and the one who comes to Me I will by no means cast out. 38 For I have come down from heaven, not to do My own will, but the will of Him who sent Me...

...39 This is the will of the Father who sent Me, that of all He has given Me I should lose nothing, but should raise it up at the last day. 40 And this is the will of Him who sent Me, that everyone who sees the Son and believes in Him may have everlasting life; and I will raise him up at the last day."

vs. 4

Verse 4

4 God also bearing witness both with (1) signs and wonders, (2) with various miracles, and gifts of the Holy Spirit, according to His own will?

He confirmed the witness of His word by giving "signs and wonders"

Signs grk: semeion;

distinct or distinguishing markers,

(intended to arrest your attention - selah)

Wonders grk: teras;

marvels or wonders so as to cause awe and amazement - selah

He also confirmed the witness of His word by giving "miracles, and gifts"

Miracles grk: dunamis;

supernatural strength, supernatural ability, supernatural purpose or meaning. To be supernatural used by the supernatural God for supernatural purposes.

Gifts

grk: merismos as in the dividing up of gifts or the distribution of "spirituals" the spiritual gifts that "graces" the church with abilities to expend for Christ sake and glory.

1Cor. 12:1-3

Now concerning spiritual gifts, brethren, I do not want you to be ignorant: 2 You know that you were Gentiles, carried away to these dumb idols, however you were led. 3 Therefore I make known to you that no one speaking by the Spirit of God calls Jesus accursed, and no one can say that Jesus is Lord except by the Holy Spirit. :4 There are diversities of gifts, but the same Spirit. 5 There are differences of ministries, but the same Lord. 6 And there are diversities of activities, but it is the same God who works all in all. 7 But the manifestation of the Spirit is given to each one for the profit of all: 8 for to one is given the word of wisdom through the Spirit, to another the word of knowledge through the same Spirit, 9 to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healings by the same Spirit, 10 to another the working of miracles, to another prophecy, to another discerning of spirits, to another different kinds of tongues, to another the interpretation of tongues. 11 But one and the same Spirit works all these things, distributing to each one individually as He wills. :12 For as the body is one and has many members, but all the members of that one body, being many, are one body, so also is Christ. 13 For by one Spirit we were all baptized into one body—whether Jews or Greeks, whether slaves or free—and have all been made to drink into one Spirit. 14 For in fact the body is not one member but many. :15 If the foot should say, "Because I am not a hand, I am not of the body," is it therefore not of the body? 16 And if the ear should say, "Because I am not an eye, I am not of the body," is it therefore not of the body.....

....17 If the whole body were an eye, where would be the hearing? If the whole were hearing, where would be the smelling? 18 But now God has set the members, each one of them, in the body just as He pleased. 19 And if they were all one member, where would the body be? :20 But now indeed there are many members, yet one body. 21 And the eye cannot say to the hand, "I have no need of you"; nor again the head to the feet, "I have no need of you." 22 No, much rather, those members of the body which seem to be weaker are necessary. 23 And those members of the body which we think to be less honorable, on these we bestow greater honor; and our unpresentable parts have greater modesty, 24 but our presentable parts have no need. But God composed the body, having given greater honor to that part which lacks it, 25 that there should be no schism in the body, but that the members should have the same care for one another.

Eph. 4:11-14

And He Himself gave some to be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, and some pastors and teachers, 12 for the equipping of the saints for the work of ministry, for the edifying of the body of Christ, 13 till we all come to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to a perfect man, to the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ; 14 that we should no longer be children, tossed to and fro and carried about with every wind of doctrine.

Rom. 12:1-8

I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that you present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable to God, which is your reasonable service. 2 And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, that you may prove what is that good and acceptable and perfect will of God. :3 For I say, through the grace given to me, to everyone who is among you, not to think of himself more highly than he ought to think, but to think soberly, as God has dealt to each one a measure of faith....

....4 For as we have many members in one body, but all the members do not have the same function, 5 so we, being many, are one body in Christ, and individually members of one another. 6 Having then gifts differing according to the grace that is given to us, let us use them: if prophecy, let us prophesy in proportion to our faith; 7 or ministry, let us use it in our ministering; he who teaches, in teaching; 8 he who exhorts, in exhortation; he who gives, with liberality; he who leads, with diligence; he who shows mercy, with cheerfulness.
